This week in our IPC lessons, Year 1 was experimenting the different techniques that we could use to make a boat. The children thought of and suggested a range of materials both water proof and porous to enable the boats stay afloat. As a boat floats in the water, it pushes aside water making space for the boat. This is displacement. The water then pushes back on the sides and bottom of the boat. How to reinforce your child's learning over the holiday

Many things are learned in the school environment but now holiday is near and children need to keep on learning, I hope the following tips will be helpful to parents.

- Use household items as an excuse to learn things without it being obvious especially for younger children.
- Use jigsaw puzzles to teach a number of things: Geographical jigsaws can teach a child the names of countries, cities, and regions. They can also show the concept of borders. Patterned jigsaws can teach sequencing and pattern recognition.
- Cook together. Cooking is a great mathematical lesson in disguise, as well as one about nutrition.
- Watch historical documentaries and movies together. An easy history lesson that all the family can enjoy.
- Get out of the house and visit places with fun lessons. Museums, science centers, cinema, children's theater, playgrounds, factory tours, etc., all offer plenty of learning opportunities that involve interaction.
- Start a garden for your child to care for. This will involve a number of lessons such as plant care.
- Suggest that your child keep a journal. This will help with improving writing skills.

Relax and enjoy their childhood. Children grow up fast, and spending time listening to them, learning from them, and helping them, are all an important part of parental teaching even if these feel "effortless".
